



Seven years ago, Kalihi Union Church Worship Ministries formed the KUC Prayer Action Team. Since then it has been the mission of the Prayer Action Team (PAT) to lead KUC in becoming a house of prayer by providing opportunities for all believers to pray. Our vision is to see the Holy Spirit flowing through the life and ministry of our church resulting in many people coming to know our wonderful Lord & Savior.

Since its inception, the PAT has been working toward 11 strategic goals, many that have been reached and some still to come. One of our goals has been to establish a Prayer Room on the church campus. That goal is soon to be realized.

The PAT is currently in the process of transforming our Bridal Room into a dedicated Prayer Room. The room will still be available for use as a Bridal Room, but otherwise will be set aside strictly for the purpose of prayer. The purpose of the Prayer Room will be:

To provide a central place where prayer might be offered up for individuals, the church, the nation and the world.

HOW YOU CAN PARTICIPATE...

Beginning in September we will make available a sign-up board where people can sign-up for 1-hour time slots to use the room each week. Initially, the Prayer Room will be open during business hours and until 10pm, but we hope eventually to have people praying 24/7. Our desire is that the KUC Prayer Room will be used by people of all ages—children, teens, young adults and seniors.

Imagine teens praying an hour a week for their families, their school and lost friends. Imagine children praying for their family and friends. Imagine Sunday School teachers praying weekly for their students. Imagine ministry leaders praying for those under their care and for those they are trying to reach with the gospel. Imagine a place where hurting people can come to be prayed for knowing that they can find healing for body, mind and spirit.

There is still much to be done in furnishing and organizing the Prayer Room Ministry, so please pray for us. If you would like to volunteer as a Prayer Captain to oversee the room once a week let us know. The more volunteers we have, the more successful this ministry can be.
