Our theme for today: Nothing Impossible

It's interesting isn't it? Ahaz was told to ask for a sign, and he refused; he was disobedient. Then, if you recall the story of Elizabeth and Zechariah (parents of John the Baptist) you'll see that Zechariah asks for a sign and he ends up mute for three days! But Mary never asked, nor did she resist the signs around her. She simply pondered them. Of course, Mary does receive a sign. It is her older relative Elizabeth's swelling pregnancy... if God could spark new life in a much older woman, surely God could do the same for Mary.

Reflections

"For nothing will be impossible with the word spoken by God."

We've all had people come alongside with encouraging words such as, "you can do it, go for it, it will be ok!" The words help, but sometimes we might yet feel helpless. It doesn't matter what the other person says, you might feel that it really is impossible. So, even if Gabriel came to you in your *impossible* situation, you could still say, "Yeah, right! That's not going to happen!" But it's not really Gabriel who is making the claim, it is God Himself – nothing will be impossible with God – the author, creator, sovereign, everlasting, never-ending, all omnipotent, all-seeing, all-knowing, transcendent, King of Kings and Lord of Lords – nothing is impossible with Him!

So far, in all of these devotionals, and even in the ones to come, are you sensing it much about our being *with* God?

Do you remember the story of Abraham and Sarah? God came to them and announced that they would have a child, Isaac. When the Lord announced the impending birth of Isaac, Sarah laughed! Here's how the Lord responded in that situation, *"Is anything too wonderful for*

Yahweh?" (Genesis 18:14—see also Jesus' comment at Luke 18:27). This is truly the Gospel—Good News for those of us who find ourselves in impossible situations, isn't it? Ever been caught between a rock and a hard place? Ever felt what it's like to be in an untenable situation with no exit—trapped? Remember, as we walk *with* the Lord, no situation is beyond redemption. Nothing is impossible *with* God! Today, is your life *with* Him?

Prayer and Song

Take time to pray and sing praises to Him. Here is one we've provided by Frances Ridley Havergal.
