- 5. Is every disciple also a "disciple-maker?" What does it mean to be a "disciple-maker?"
- 6. Jesus is the master discipler. How does Jesus model discipleship?
- 7. What does it mean to "invest" in someone, in the context of discipleship?
- 8. Why is "being together" and "sharing life" essential components of disciple-making? How have you seen this modeled in your life?
